Greetings in the Name of our Risen Lord!

Today, the provincial government announced significant additional measures to fight the deadly COVID-19 virus and the escalating spread of the variants. These measures have extended the stay-at-home orders, both in breadth and in duration. The previously announced four week period has now been extended to six.

The additional measures do not have any impact on the "Red Stage" guidelines of "Loving Our Neighbours" that were put in place during Holy Week. The limitations for those in the building during online worship recording or live-streaming remains at 5 in our diocese. Our buildings remain closed other than for the recording or live-streaming of worship. Weddings and baptisms should be postponed. Funerals (held in a funeral home or graveside) are now limited to 10 people by the province.


We continue to ask that everyone respect both the intent and the detail of the 'stay-at-home' as much as possible. This is our only real defence as the drive to vaccinate the province moves forward. We pray for all those who are sick, those who have passed away from this dreadful virus, those who mourn and those who are on the front lines of health and community care. Please take care of yourselves and each other.


Blessings of the Easter Season. May the presence of our Risen Lord guide and comfort us.
