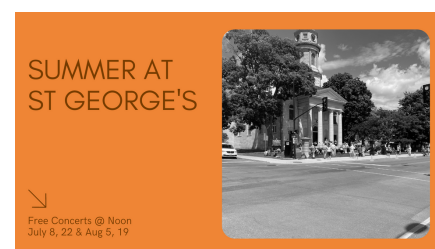

## ARCHITECTURE of the 20<sup>th</sup> CENTURY in the KINGSTON REGION

One area of Kingston's architecture that has not been thoroughly examined is when and how architects and their clients responded to the radical changes in architecture in Germany and France in the early 20<sup>th</sup> century. New ideas about form and function, building materials and style via the Bauhaus school, Walter Gropius, Mies van der Rohe and Le Corbusier spread through publications and via some architects immigrating to the United States in the 1930s. How did Kingston fit into the picture with architects such as Colin Drever and Al Cromarty? Did traditional styles and forms survive? More controversial: *today's buildings are tomorrow's heritage.*

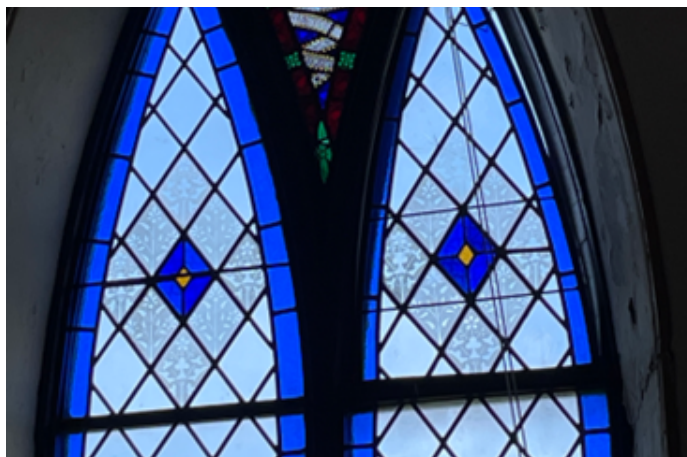

## Great Hall Restorations

The work has begun on the restoration of three of the Great Hall windows. The condition of the windows became critical and could not be left to fail any longer. The company doing the work is Heritage Grade located out of Ottawa . They have the glass and wood working expertise to complete such restorations. The three windows are all on the south side of the building. They consist of the tall hall window, the choir master's window and an office window.

The Cathedral Executive have approval to utilize funds from the Heritage Reserve Trust to start the work. The cost estimate to complete the restorations is \$96,000.

Knowing this necessary work was required the Cathedral Project's Group has already had a fund raiser "Stained Glass Revival" on June 17, 2023 towards this work. If anyone would like more detail about the restorations or how to support the cost, please contact the Wardens or the office.
