#### **READINGS**

Jeremiah 8:18-9:1; Psalm 79:1-9 1 Timothy 2:1-7; Luke 16:1-13



From September 1-October 4, 2025, we celebrate the Season of Creation with our ecumenical siblings around the world. This year, the theme is **Peace with Creation**, inspired by Isaiah 32: 14-18. Our global faith leaders hope that through considering this theme, we will 'allow creation to find peace when justice is restored'. There are many great resources for personal and communal prayer available at www.seasonofcreation.org, some of which you may encounter in our liturgies through the season.

During this time, the liturgical colour is orange. Symbolically, orange is the colour of fire and flame: the red of passion tempered by the yellow of wisdom, the colour of harvest, fruitfulness, joy and symbolic of endurance and strength. While our newsletter looks dashing in Cathedral red (nice to match the choir!), for the Season of Creation it will honour the liturgical colour and be orange.

In addition to our acknowledgement of the Season of Creation, we also consider in Sunday's liturgies that it is **Holy Cross Day** (The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross), commemorating the cross as the instrument of Christ's victory over sin and death. Our Gradual Hymn, which Phil Rogers has written about in a blog on our website, will be *In the Cross of Christ I Glory*, and the Gospel will turn us towards that celebration as well. Sunday also happens to be Battle of Britain Sunday. On Holy Cross Day in 2022, Dean Doug Michael was installed as Dean!
